Sur Futuro will serve as the fiscal agent and coordinating entity for the BTE program. We seek to reduce the high levels of poverty and marginalization of poor communities in the Dominican Republic by promoting the sustainable management of the environment and natural resources.

OUTCOMES (May 2023)

- 80% of BTE graduates obtain an academic index of at least 80 in math and science subjects.
- 60% of BTE graduates receive a technical certificate.
- 3 80% of BTE graduates are accepted into higher education.
- 4 50% of BTE graduates accepted into higher education elect a STEM²D major.
- 60% of BTE graduates obtain a scholarship to attend higher education.
- 90% of BTE graduates have the life/work-readiness skills needed for higher education, work, or entrepreneurial success.

CONTEXT

Johnson & Johnson in partnership with Sur Futuro, Centro Educativo Juan Emilio Bosch Gaviño, the Ministry of Education (0407 District), the Superior Education Ministry, the Universidad Autónoma de Santo Domingo, Instituto Tecnologico de Santo Domingo, Instituto de Formación Técnica Profesional, and Pontificia Universidad Católica Madre y Maestra will launch a Bridge to Employment (BTE) program in Bajos de Haina, Dominican Republic.. The three-year program targets 50 students attending attending Centro Educativo Juan Emilio Bosch Gaviño and enrolled in Year 3 in school year 2019/2020.

BTE seeks to:

- Increase in the number of youth enrolling in higher education
- Increase in the number of youth pursuing careers in the Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics, Manufacturing, and Design (STEM²D) disciplines.

BTE will benefit Haina's youth and address key challenges at Centro Educativo Juan Emilio Bosch Gaviño, including improving academic achievement, reducing the dropout rate, increasing the graduation rate, and increasing the rate of higher education enrollment.
