




Easthampstead Park Community School



BTE Bracknell



- We work with Easthampstead Park Community School
- Berkshire (30mins from Heathrow/1hr from LDN)
- Formed in 1972
- C.900 students aged 11-18







Moving to Self Sustaining









Johnson AJohnson MEDTECH

- 52 students enrolled in programme
- 20 making it to yr.3
- 19 of those enrolled in yr. 3 going on to further education.
- First student to ever be accepted to Oxford
- •39 sessions completed over the 3 years
- 400+ hours of J&J volunteering

- 12 month rolling programme
- Nov thru Oct
- First term of yr.12 through to first term of yr. 13
- Funded by J&J MedTech UK/IRL.
- £15K budget
- £5K for connectr support
- £10K for ABTS (not used 2022)
- Long term goal is to have all sites self sustaining and funded from central CSR budget



BTE Bracknell ERG Project

Overview

Sessions during January, February, March, and May will be in conjunction with J&J ERGs - WLI, BAME and Open & Out.

February - WLI March - BAME April - Open & Out

The May session will act as the presentation session where students will present back on the challenge set. Students will be spit into pairs by their teachers (Mr. Lake) and act as a consultancy firm that are 'gitching' to become the schools Dol partner.

The sessions will be hosted via zoom recording and introduced by the site champion. Each ERG will present for cl5mins on their specific ERG, sharing slides on their current strategy, challenges they face and how they make an impact. A task will then be set as part of a stage gated approach to ensure they are working toward the end task. The students will be asked to watch the recording in their own time, complete the stage gate tasks and submit to the site coordinator and site champion.

The Challeng

Teams (pairs) will be asked to act as a consultancy firm that are pitching to become the school's D&I partner.

They will be asked to:

- Come up with a consultancy company name
- Identify the problem that needs solving (could be increasing diversity in student population/teacher population/encouraging diversity in sports/STEM subjects etc.)
- population/reacher population/encouraging diversity in sports/s1EM subjects etc.)

 Identify what currently exists/What's missing/What would they keep/What would they chande?
- Understand and report on what do other schools do?
- Show what can they take from J&J?
- Make final recommendations and suggest how they would measure and changes?

Teams will present back 'Dragon's Den/Shark Tank' style during the May session.

Volunteer Role

Lead volunteer/Site Champion to facilitate recorded session and ensure it is sent to students no later than 24hrs after scheduled date.

Volunteers to

- Introduce themselves before the start of each ERG presentation
- Engage with slides/presenter to share their own experiences

- Sessions ran from Jan May 2021 (virtual)
- Feb April sessions hosted by J&J ERG's
 - WLI
 - BAME
 - 0&0
- Students had to create their own strategy and present back 'Dragon's Den' style and pitch their strategy
- ERG leads acted as 'Dragons'
